MURDER AT THE HELL HOLF IN ILLAWARRA A D 1826

THOUGH Wollongong has grown ever more rapidly from a mail country town to a city of over 150,000 people, there re still, within three miles of its centre, places unouched by the changes of the last forty years. One such s the deep valley between Mt Keira and Mt Nebo through hich runs the stream shown on modern maps as Byarong, yrarong or Millbrook Creek, known earlier as the Mill rook and, according to Alexander Stewart, known earlier till as Hell Hole Creek.

The name of Mill Brook was derived from two water mills uilt on the creek by James Stares Spearing who, Stewart tates, had been a master miller in the Old Country and lso had a windmill at "Paulegrove", his home at Mt eira".

But whence came the creek's sinister old name?

In the deep valley of Evarong Creek, at the time of riting, the outermost point on a trafficable road is at he end of Koloona Avenue. From there, looking back, the ormon Church in Yellagong Street can be seen, close to he site of Spearing's house'. From the end of the road track leads through sliprails and a fence to an old oad following up the left bank of the creek.

Perhaps even by Wollongong standards it is flattering o call it a road, but it is something more than a trackgood deal of construction work has been carried out at ne time or another - and only by much cutting and filling as it been possible to avoid crossing and re-crossing the reek. Where the main creek, descending from the neighourhood of the Mt Keira Scouts' Camp, is joined by a oud sized tributary coming from the direction of O'Brien's ap it crosses to the other bank and starts to climb the ack of Mt Nebo towards the road made by Cornelius O'Brien n Governor Macquarie's day (ante-dating by some thirteen ears Major Mitchell's Mt Keira Road) which runs up an astern spur of Mt Nebo and along the razorback connectng it to the main range.

At or about the junction of the two creeks the name of ell Hole still figures on the parish maps. There is nohing hellish about it now. At the junction the narrow
